



## HREZI LEGAL TEAM TO DEPOSE JOHN LARSON

Hartford, CT – As part of their ongoing legal battle against Connecticut’s unconstitutional ballot-access laws, Muad Hrezi and his legal team will be deposing Representative John Larson. Representative Larson and his campaign filed to intervene in the case, joining the state and state party as defendants in the lawsuit. The deposition is set for Saturday, July 16th, ahead of the four-day trial beginning on Tuesday, July 19th.

“It’s ridiculous that this legal process even has to take place. It should not be this difficult for a candidate to get on the ballot in our state,” said Hrezi. “Mr. Larson decided to intervene on the side of less democracy, and we’ll be asking him why. This trial is about more than just this election cycle. We’re fighting for change across the state to ensure voters have a say and the democratic process has a chance.”

Connecticut has the most restrictive ballot-access laws in the country. It is the only state to never have a primary challenge against a sitting member of the U.S. House of Representatives.

Hrezi, a former policy advisor to U.S. Senator Chris Murphy and a son of Libyan asylum seekers, has raised over \$520k in this race, including more than two times the number of individual donors in Connecticut as compared to Representative Larson. He has received endorsements from local elected officials and grassroots organizations including Sunrise Movement CT, Black Lives Matter 860, and the Free Puerto Rico Initiative.

Representative Larson has been in office since 1999 and is the longest-serving House Democrat without a primary challenge. He is the fifth-highest recipient of corporate PAC money among House Democrats.
