On Saturday 02/10/2024, at approximately 0310 hours, Lt Greene contacted me at home and advised there was an untimely death with the victim identified as Alexandra Standish 07/26/1986. That the Bristol Police Department contacted our agency to inform us a male identified as Brandon Hamel 08/24/1987, arrived at Bristol Hospital with Standish who was unresponsive in the passenger seat of his vehicle.

Upon arrival to the Wolcott Police Department, I coordinated with Lt. Greene and other Wolcott Police Department Detectives. Detective Virgulto and I then responded to Bristol Hospital Emergency Room. Upon arrival at approximately 0420 hours, we met Bristol Police Officers, Sgt. Jones, and Officer DeCosta, who was standing by a white Subaru BRZ bearing Ct. registration AS51572. At this time Brandon Hamel, (who from here on out will be referred to as B.Hamel), was secured in the back of Wolcott Police Officer Pelletier's marked police vehicle. Officer Pelletier later transported B. Hamel to the Wolcott Police Department. Sgt. Jones lead us into one of the Trauma rooms. Present in the Trauma room at this time was Bristol Hospital Charge Nurse Jo Ann Howard and Bristol Police Officer J. Yager. Standish's deceased body was on a gurney covered with a white sheet. I initially examined Standish's body and observed numerous injuries consisting of bruises, scrapes, and abrasions to her forehead, face, torso, back, pelvic region, both arms, legs, ankles, and feet. As I began photographing Standish's body to document her injuries, Bristol Hospital ER technician Briella Shepard entered the Trauma room. Shepard assisted Detective Virgulto in turning Standish's body in order to photograph the back of her body. Shepard later explained that she was one of the first people to responded outside and saw Standish slumped on the passenger side floor of the car and security had video. I then took possession of Standish's property that had been gathered by Bristol Hospital staff and inventoried for officers. Standish's property was later transported back to the Wolcott Police Department and later transferred into the custody of the Ct. State Police Western District Major Crime

Officer Virgulto and I then met with Bristol Hospital security officers Alaina Pataky 05/12/1990, and Robin Brown 09/18/1971. Pataky then played the security footage from outside the Main Emergency Department (ED) entrance, which showed in part at the following.

At: 2:21:56 AM, B.Hamel pulls up to and parks the white Subaru in front of the ED entrance.

2:22:14 AM, B.Hamel comes into view, he's seen wearing a greenish/tan and white Adidas hooded sweatshirt, greenish/gray knit hat, grayish colored pants and white and black Nike sneakers. He calmly walks into the ED entrance, grabs a wheelchair, returns to the passenger side of the Subaru and opens the door. It appears he then attempts to remove Standish from the vehicle but is having trouble.

2:23:25 AM, B.Hamel calmly walks into the ED entrance, and asks security officers Pataky and Brown for help then returns to the Subaru.

2:24:18 AM, Pataky and Brown approach the vehicle to assist but B. Hamel and wheel chair are blocking them from getting to Standish.

2:25:53 AM, Brown enters ED seeking assistance from medical personnel.

2:27:05 AM, Brown exits with two (2) medical personnel, one female (1), and one (1) male, referred to as "Nate". They approach the vehicle to assist Standish, but B. Hamel is standing in the way blocking access to her.

2:27:16 AM, "Nate" runs back into the ED, request more assistance and returns with a gurney and additional personnel.

2:28:05 AM, hospital personnel physically remove B. Hamel from blocking access to Standish and push him to the rear of the Subaru. B. Hamel appears to be hostile and is held back by security and hospital personnel.

2:28:23 AM, Standish is removed from the passenger side of the Subaru and placed on the gurney.

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2:28:46 AM, "Nate" jumps onto the gurney and begins performing CPR on Standish as she's wheeled into the ED. Due to B. Hamel's behavior at this time, security refuses to let him enter the ED.

2:29:26 AM, B. Hamel drives the Subaru to the upper lot and parks.

The video footage was saved on a USB drive by Bristol Hospital Security and later delivered to the Wolcott Police Department. (Reference my Axon Body Worn Camera and Sgt. Spiotti's Supplemental)

I then photographed the white Subaru bearing Ct, registration AS51572 in the parking lot of Bristol Hospital. I was informed that the vehicle had not been move since being park by B. Hamel, and later secured by Bristol Police. The vehicle was later towed to the Wolcott Police Department and stored in the sally port by Avenue Auto, where it would be processed at a later date/time by the Ct. State Police Western District Major Crimes Unit.

The photos taken of Standish's body/injuries and the white Subaru were downloaded and forwarded to Ct. State Police Western District Major Crimes Unit.

Upon returning to the Wolcott Police Department, Detective Jackson and I spoke with B. Hamel, who was seated in the interview room. At this time we learned "Jim" identified as James Sadlowski 07/03/1992, was with B. Hamel and Standish in the hours prior to them arriving at Bristol Hospital. B. Hamel stated "Jim" has been staying at the Meriden Inn, in Meriden, Ct. and he drives a white Chevy pick-up truck. (Reference my Axon Body Worn Camera and Detective Jackson's Supplemental)

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Detective Jackson and I then responded to the Meriden Inn, located at 1102 East Main St., Meriden Ct. in an attempt to locate Sadlowski. Upon arrival we were met by several Meriden Police Officers, one of which checks the parking lot for a white pick-up truck. We entered the lobby and asked the woman behind the counter if she was familiar with Sadlowski. She replied yes, he stays in room 22 just around the corner. We responded to room 22, knocked on the door but received no response from inside. This woman stated she last saw Sadlowski the day before but was not sure at what time. She was given a business card and asked to call if he returned. (Reference my Axon Body Worn Camera)

After dropping Detective Jackson off at the Wolcott Police Department, I responded 129 Central Avenue, where I met the Detectives from the CSP Western District Major Crime Unit who were processing the scene. CSP finished processing the driveway of 129 Central Avenue, and needed to process the interior of the residence. Knowing there were at least two dogs inside the residence, CSP asked us to clear the interior and secure the dogs.

Animal Control Officer Kish, Detective Virgulto, Sgt. Garguilo, and I entered through the garage and then into the interior of the residence. Upon entering we were hit with a heavy smell of animal urine and feces. The two dogs were located in an upstairs bedroom and secured in there until they were later removed by ACO Kish and transported to the Wolcott Dog Pound for safe keeping. It should be noted that the interior of the residence was in complete disarray, with clothing strewn about, dog, cat, and bird feces and urine on the floors throughout the

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residence. In the kitchen the refrigerator was pulled from the wall and had some sort of food/liquid substance stuck to the door. Piles of dirty dishes in the sink, on the counter tops and moldy food in a crock pot. I did not observe one room in the residence that was not either filthy dirty or in disarray. (Reference my Axon Body Worn Camera)

At approximately 1245 hours, Detective Jackson contacted me to say Sadlowski called and that he was at Ground Zero Airsoft Field located at 223 Wolcott Road, Terryville, Ct. That he and Detective Virgulto were heading there to speak with Sadlowski. I responded to Ground Zero where I located Detectives Jackson and Virgulto who were speaking with Sadlowski, James Burrow 07/11/1965, and Nate Cartwright 05/02/1992. (Reference my Axon Body Worn Camera and Detective Jackson's Supplemental)

I then returned to 129 Central Avenue and remained on scene until CSP Western District Major Crime Unit finished processing the residence. I signed for and took custody of two cardboard (2) boxes that contained multiple pieces of potential evidence that had been collected by CSP Western District Major Crime Unit.

Officer Talbot, ACO Kish, and myself entered the residence and remove two (2) cats and a parakeet for safe keeping. ACO transported the animals to the Wolcott Dog Pound. At 1735 hours, the residence was secured and the scene cleared.

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
