On 2/7/2024 at 2351 hours, Alexandra Standish (7/26/86) contacted the Wolcott Police Department to report that her motion lights kept activating and she could hear some one walking on her back porch. Ofc. Zambetti and I responded to her home located on 129 Central Avenue.

Upon arrival, I observed a Caucasian male later identified as Brandon Hamel (8/24/87) standing in the drive way in front of the garage doors. He stated he was in an argument with Alexandra so he went outside to smoke a cigarette and blow off steam. When he returned to the home, the front door was locked so he attempted to enter from the rear door. Brandon stated that this incident remained verbal and there was no physical contact or threats made by either party.

Alexandra stated she did not know Brandon was still on the property and agreed they had an argument. She continued to say that she locked the door and she felt safe if Brandon reentered the home. Officers left the scene.

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On 2/8/2024 at 0057 hours, Brandon contacted the Wolcott Police Department to report that Alexandra bit and assaulted him inside their home. Sgt. Gulick, Ofc. McCormack and I responded to 129 Central Avenue.

Upon arrival, Brandon was on the front porch with an aggravated demeanor. He stated that he would go back to jail again and that he needs to get out of the home. Brandon would not answer any further inquiries of what happened and told officers to ask Alexandra. I did not notice any injuries and there were none reported.

I spoke with Alexandra at the front door and immediately observed a red and blue bump in the middle of her forehead, a white powdery substance consistent to dry-wall on her clothing and she pointed to a red colored injury on her leg that was caused from this incident. Alexandra stated that this incident became physical between the two after they were arguing about paying bills. She was standing outside the bedroom door and Brandon busted it down. This resulted in the door hitting her in the head making her fall back into a wall. She then entered the bedroom and Brandon had her on the ground and was hovering over her. This is when she bit him in what she claimed to be self defense. During this altercation, a bag of white powder for cats spilled and covered her. Alexandra also reported a scratch on her big toe. She refused medical treatment.

Brandon was taken into custody and transported to the Wolcott Police Department. I was advised by the other officers that Brandon had stated he kicked down the bedroom door.

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Brandon was processed until he was released after paying a \$1,000.00 surety bail. He is set to appear at the Waterbury Court House located on 400 Grand Street at 0900 hours. Brandon was issued a conditions of release that include the following:

Do not assault, threaten, abuse, harass, follow, interfere with, or stalk the protected person. (CT01)

Stay away from the home of the protected person and wherever the protected person shall reside.(CT03)

Do not contact the protected person in any manner, including by written, electronic or telephone contact, and do not contact the protected person's home, workplace, or others with whom the contact would be likely to cause annoyance or alarm to the protected person. (CT05)

Do not use or possess a dangerous weapon.

Do not use or possess an intoxicant or controlled substance.(alcohol or drugs)

Brandon stated he understood these conditions. The conditions of release was entered into NCIC/COLLECT (Message Number:4040687).

While processing, Brandon was wearing a silver colored ring that Alexandra wanted back. It was later transported to Alexandra at her home after she gave clothing and Brandon's immediate items he would need for court in the morning. Alexandra was advised of Brandon's release.

A Domestic Violence form was completed. Ofc. McCormack completed a Connecticut Domestic Violence Lethality Screen with Alexandra on scene. She did not screen in as high danger.

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
